Davis of 2105 Brentwood Ave in High Point stated in his family records in 1939: "They went to Jackson Co., Ohio, and lived near Wellsto Ohio. They raised a large family. Some went to Iowa an became wealthy."

\*\* According to the 1850 census, Mary and Archibald Leach were keeping her parents (Stephen and Lizzie) in their home. Archie's dates were 1819 - 1879)

<u>Davies of Moore County</u>: The Davises were a numerous and probably in some cases unrelated clan. <u>Hardy</u> and Robert apparently lived north of Spies in the Jug Town area. <u>Ralph</u> Davis (unrelated to our Davis clan) was located at the head of Governor's Creek. <u>Matthew (Mathis) Davis</u> bought the Pate tract on the south side of Wad's Creek after the old George Stutts (now Wicker) tract near Kennedy McKenzie's present home. The spring is still known as the "Davis Spring"

Yows of Moore County: Christopher Yow lived on the old Salem Road between Bear Creek and the crossroad at Nicholas Nalls' (Needham Grove Old School House) pg. 336 - Ibid; Wicker,1968

(Family records today record the Yow community as being on "Tory Hill" and sometimes referred to as "Flint Hill" east of Robbins.)
