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
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

89. Bensalem Church Cemetery
This cemetery is located on county road #1270 just West of where
county road #1276 junctions. This is a very large and very old
cemetery. It has been said by some of the older members that there
are graves on top of graves in this cemetery. This cemetery is
kept by the church for it's members and their families.

## BENSALEM PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

(Information from Harold Blue)

About the year 1790 there was a little log house built near the present site of Bensalem Church for a Mr. Wm. Boudoin to preach in. Regular services were held here until 1794. At this time the Rev. John Kadie began preaching at a place known as the Old Store near the head of McLendon's Creek. He preached here until 1797 when he was succeeded by the Rev. Colin Londsay, who continued preaching at this same place until 1802.

A log church was built four miles northeast of the Old Store preaching place at the home of Murdock Martin. Preaching was held here by Rev. Lindsay until 1811.

In 1813, the Rev. Murdock McMillan began preaching at the present site of Bensalem Church; at first it was a brush arbor, but in that same first year a log building was built and the Ottery Church was organized. The Rev. Murdock McMillan was the first with Alexander Leach, Hezekiah Ottery and Murdock McAuley the first elders.

The name of the church was changed from Ottery's to Bensalem in the year 1830.

# MECHANICS BAPTIST CHURCH 1818-1820

Acorn Ridge Baptist Church was first established as Mechanics Hill Baptist Church in 1818. A church building was erected on land donated by David Kennedy and built with lumber from David's sawmill. The first pastor was Rev. Artemus Shattuck. David Kennedy was the first deacon. Conner Dowd was elected the first clerk of the church.

The church grew and prospered until 1884, when in search for a new location, the church divided, half of the congregation establishing itself at Acorn Ridge and took with it the church name (Mechanic Hill Baptist Church). The other half of the congregation established itself east of Hemp and took with them the building and the church Bible. This church became known as Flint Hill Baptist Church.

In 1968, Mechanic Hill Baptist Church changed its name to Acorn Ridge and has been known as this ever since.

Acorn Ridge has been a school site and a meeting place of some sort for over 225 years.

The graveyard is 150 yards south of the well and in a grove of large oaks on the side of a hill.

This is a very large cemetery approximately two acres with most of the graves being poorly marked. Some of the markers made from lighter knots have been destroyed by fires leaving only depressions in the ground.

This cemetery was first started by an act of violence about 1781.

Col. Wade returned to Cumberland-Moore to revenge the Piney Bottom massacre. Col. Wade and his men swooped down on the Kenneth Clark place now known as the Markham place, killing Loyalist John Clark, Duncan Currie, Daniel McMillian and Alexander McLeod, all of which are supposed to be buried here although no markers could be found.

#### 274. Sanders Family Cemetery

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This cemetery is located on county road #1433. You go north on county road #1433 from where it junctions with State Hwy. #27 for 1.7 miles. The cemetery is in a sharp bend of the road marked by a large cedar tree. Part of these graves have been fenced in by members of the family. This county road, #1433 follows the Old Catawba road bed.

There are thirty to thirty-five other graves marked and unmarked without inscriptions. The ground around this cemetery is covered with periwinkle.

#### 275. Morgan Family Cemetery

This cemetery is located off county road #1433. You go north on county road #1433 from where it junctions with State Hwy. #27 for .8 mile. Take dirt road west for .4 mile, then go north on private farm road for .5 mile to the cemetery on a high ridge below where Cabin Creek and Mill Creek forks.
